President's Message

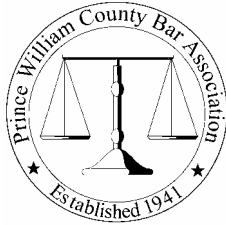

Circuit Court Administration Update

We have nearly completed our renovation work. Thank you for your patience during the construction. All that remains is delivery of new chairs and tables for our reception area in room 310 and in the jury assembly room. As many of you know, I and the criminal division are not as out in the open as we used to be. No one dislikes that more than me. But unfortunately it comes as part of the heightened security for the whole building. Please know that we will still endeavor to give you the same service as before. Please come to room 310 to review a criminal file or to file something in a criminal case. If you need to see me please let our front counter know and they will track me down. You can also reach me by phone at 703-792-6034. The renovation work was long over due and we really like our new furniture and increased space. When all the furniture is in place we will have an open house to show it off.

On another subject, we are working on a new case management system that we hope to bring online this year. It is a Windows browser based system that I think you will find more user-friendly. The system is designed for remote access and e-filing when those are options. All orders will be scanned as digital images and available to view on line. This will be a big step forward for the office when it is completed.

We need your help with scheduling Spanish interpreters. Unlike the two District Courts we do not have an interpreter present each day. Also, if you had an interpreter in the district court, this does not automatically schedule one for Circuit Court. Interpreters are scheduled only when needed. Please advise us in writing when you need an interpreter. Shari who works at the information counter beside the elevators is the person on our staff who schedules interpreters. She can be reached at 703-792-6009. Just as important is letting us know if an interpreter is not needed or only needed for a shorter period of time after they are scheduled. If an interpreter is scheduled for a day long case that does not go we still pay the interpreter accordingly.

J&DR District Court Policy Updates

From Frances Hedrick

The J&DR District Court has amended its Spanish Interpreter Policy concerning attorneys scheduling interpreters. The applicable sections now read:

In addition to in-court proceedings, interpreter services may include public counter assistance in the J&DR Clerk's Office, attorney/client and probation officer/client interviews at the courthouse, or requests for assistance by any office of the court.

Interpreting services provided outside of normal business hours require pre-approval by an authorized court official. The attorney requesting interpreter services will first need to obtain authorization from the court prior to contacting the interpreter. The attorney will be required to contact the J&DR Clerk's Office and provide case information and meeting information which will be noted to the case file, and upon approval, will serve as the court appointment for the interpreter to provide services. The interpreter should confirm there has been pre-authorization by the court prior to providing the services.

An additional notice received from the J&DR District Court concerns a name change for The Honorable Janice Brice and reads:

"Effective immediately, please note the name change of The Honorable Janice Justina Brice to The Honorable Janice Justina Wellington".

Highlights of Virginia State Bar Council Meeting

At its regular meeting on March 3, 2006, in Richmond, the Virginia State Bar Council heard the following significant reports and took the following actions:

FastCase—the Virginia State Bar’s new online legal research service—was up and running earlier than the March 1, 2006, start-up date. Few problems have been reported. The service is provided as a membership benefit, without charge, to active, associate, judicial and emeritus members of the bar who are in good standing.

A search committee has begun its work to find a new individual to serve as bar counsel to replace Barbara Ann Williams, who left in February to return to private practice at McGuire Woods. Virginia State Bar President-elect Karen A. Gould is chair of the committee, which began screening applicants in early March. The committee hopes to have a recommendation to present to the council at its June meeting.

In response to the General Assembly’s election of judicial candidates who bypassed statewide bar screening processes for state appellate vacancies, VSB President Phillip V. Anderson will appoint a task force to study judicial nominations. Members of the council expressed frustration at the 2006 Assembly’s rejection of two Court of Appeals candidates who were recommended by the VSB Judicial Nominations Committee, in favor of two who did not submit to the process in a timely fashion.

The council approved a lawyer-lookup feature on the VSB Web page, at the recommendation of the Committee on Publications and Public Information. Lawyers must sign up on the Web page to have their names, address of record and business telephone number listed in the database, which will be available to the public.

The VSB will use mass e-mails to members in extraordinary circumstances only, under a new policy adopted by the council. Mass e-mails must be approved by the executive director or a majority of the officers.

The VSB will develop a periodic electronic newsletter that will list continuing legal education programs, meeting notices and other brief items of interest to Virginia lawyers. The e-newsletter will go to members who do not unsubscribe when they receive an issue of the publication.

The council approved a change to the Rules of Professional Conduct that would give the VSB disciplinary committee authority over lawyers who are licensed in other states or countries, and who are practicing in Virginia temporarily. The change, which will be sent to the Supreme Court of Virginia for its consideration, is one of a series designed to bring Virginia into the mainstream with other states in dealing with the increasing presence in their jurisdictions of foreign lawyers representing clients. The change was recommended by the Multi-jurisdictional Practice Task Force.

The council endorsed an amendment to the Rules of Professional Conduct that would prohibit an attorney from entering into an agreement that restricts the attorney’s ability to practice law. The current rule—Rule 5.6(b)—contains language that in some circumstances allows settlement agreements to include a provision that limits a lawyer’s future practice activities. The amendment was requested by the Boyd-Graves conference and approved by the VSB Standing Committee on Legal Ethics. It will be sent to the Supreme Court for consideration.

The council unanimously adopted a resolution honoring and thanking Barbara Ann Williams for her exemplary service during the past eight years as Bar Counsel.

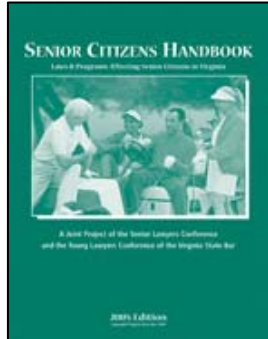

The executive board of the bar is excited to bring the membership two opportunities to help area "Seniors" this May, in honor of Law Day.

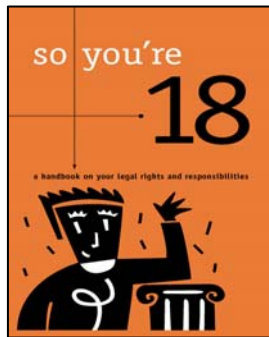


Law Day Program for Senior Citizens in Prince William County

So You're 18 Visits Area High Schools

The PWCBA is the only local bar association in the state of Virginia to purchase and distribute copies of the *So You're 18* handbook for every high school senior enrolled in local public schools. Funding for this project is made possible by the PWC Bar Foundation. This informative booklet, developed by the VSB, presents a variety of legal rights and responsibilities that change when a young person turns 18. The PWCBA also offers the schools the option of live presentations made by volunteer attorneys, in tandem with the booklet distribution. In 2006, (the 8th year for this project), 4700 booklets will be distributed to seniors enrolled in the area's 11 high schools. Class room presentations take about an hour, and a sample script is provided. Students are typically full of questions regarding criminal law, so we are hoping for good support from that segment of our bar.

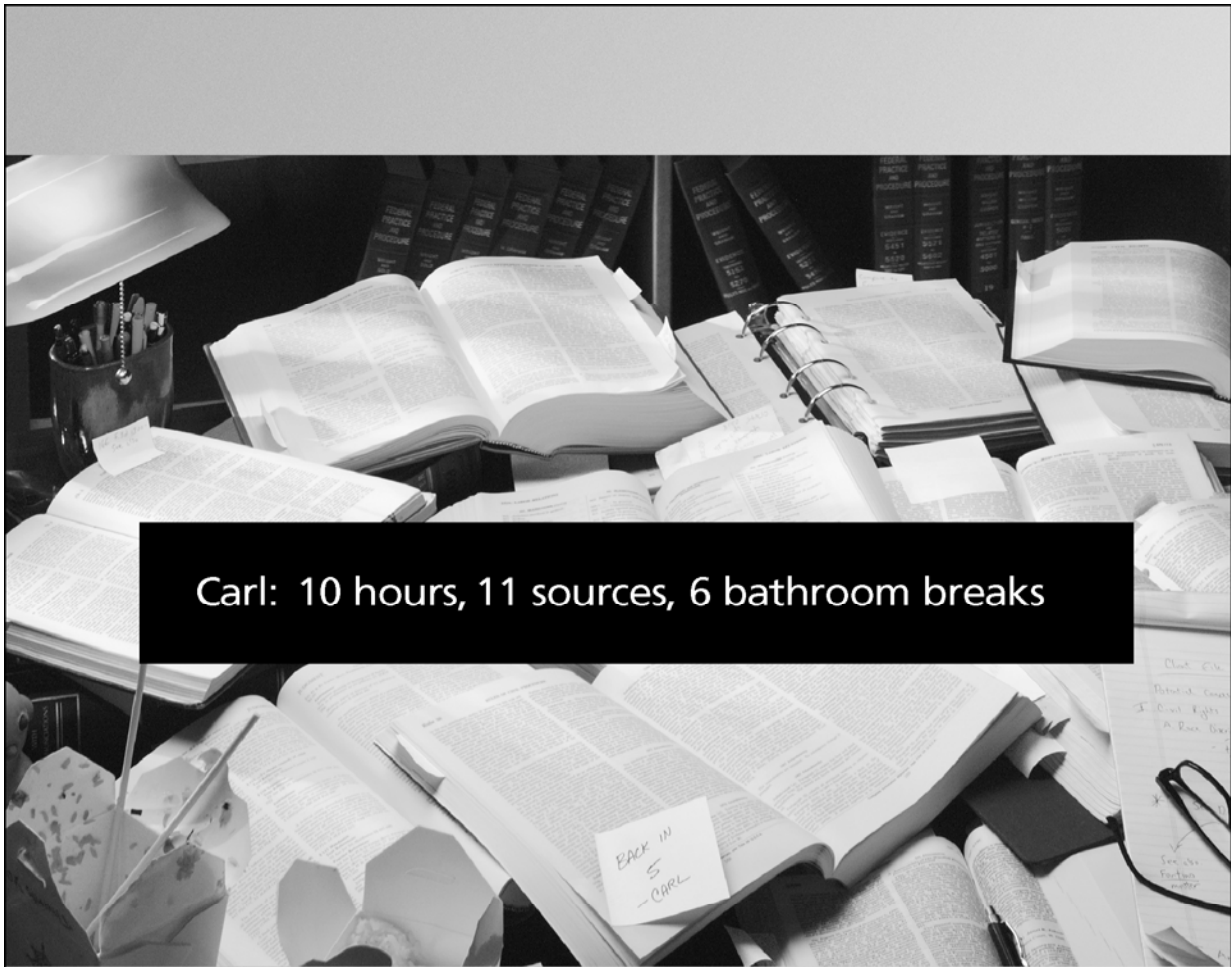

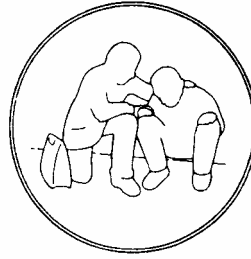

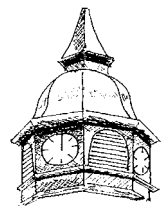
