Greetings! I have a lot to cover this month so let me get right to it.....they really don't give new presidents much "breaking in" time.....

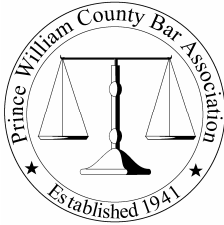

able to fund the Association's many programs, including So You're 18, Character Counts, Court Tours, and Books for Troubled Teens, among others. These programs are not funded by Association dues so it is important that we continue to provide support the Foundation in order to maintain them. If you are interested in working on a Fundraising committee, please contact me or Alissa.

Another part of celebrating our 70th anniversary was looking back to our beginnings. There were a number of historical displays at the dinner dance that showcased our original constitution, highlighted the locations of the founding member's offices back in 1941 and captured snapshots of events in the 1950's and 60's. We are grateful for the contributions from Ed McGolrick and William May which comprise a large part of these earliest artifacts. Thank you also to Bill Stephens, Bud Latimer, Alison Dixon and Sharon Pandak, for providing additional photos, newspaper clippings and memorabilia which provided a view of events and people in the 1970's and early 80's.

I could go on and on about how great the Dinner Dance was, but there are other pressing issues so I guess we'll have to leave the rest to idle gossip.

On February 12, a Saturday no less, the Board of Directors met off site to hold our first formal Board of Directors Retreat. We discussed many issues, and hope to implement some positive changes in the next year. We will be proposing Association Bylaw amendments to formally adopt an Association Mission Statement, create both a Past Presidents Council and a Young Lawyers Division, form a Fundraising Committee to organize more fundraising activities to support the Foundation, and adopt a requirement that all committees present an annual update to the Board of Directors regarding their accomplishments and other goings-on (either at a Board meeting or in writing). Of course, all of this is subject to your approval, but I wanted to let you know what we were thinking about in case any of you have any thoughts/input you'd like to share with me off line.

Some other highlights of the retreat: We tentatively adopted a 2011-2012 budget, which includes funding for some new computers for the attorney work stations in the law library, and we are looking at the possibility of providing free internet and Wi-Fi access at the courthouse for members of the Association. We also decided (as you can see) to return to full run print distribution of the Monthly Bar Association Newsletter. Alissa advised that a remarkable number of members were reporting that they didn't know about association events, didn't understand why they were no longer receiving their printed newsletters and were "not receiving" the electronic version, (thanks to spam filters). We need to keep our members connected! The newsletter will still be posted on the members only listserv, so if you don't feel like you need the printed version, let Alissa know and we'll remove you from the print list. Finally, we are in the end stages of hiring a company to update and redesign our Association website. Even with all of this, we are running a surplus (albeit a bit smaller). So rest assured, your money is being invested in services and benefits for you.

Our February luncheon featured reminiscences from many past presidents who joined us to share their memories. It was a wonderful opportunity to share in our Bar's (and its member's) history....some of it quite amusing. Tracey Lennox, our Bar Historian, will be sharing more about that elsewhere in this month's newsletter, so be sure to keep a look out!

This month's Luncheon will feature Dawn Oliver with the Intensive Community Supervision Program. This will be an informational presentation and an opportunity to ask questions in a casual setting. Please plan to attend on Friday March 4.

Finally, I have been in touch with Chief Judge Farris about scheduling our first Bench Board meeting with the Circuit Court judges. I will advise as soon as it is set, and in the meantime, please feel free to forward me any issues you would like see addressed.

I sincerely hope there is less to report next month.....but am not counting on it. Come on Spring!

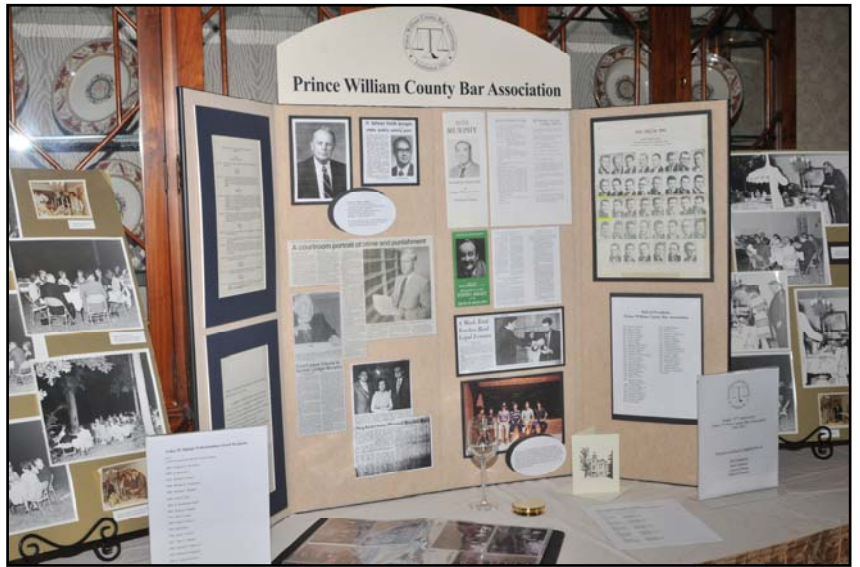

PWC Bar Association Historian and Past President's Council Updates

The Prince William County Bar Association has named a Bar Historian, and it's me. Good news, because I've secretly wanted this job for years. The job of the Bar Historian, as I understand it, is to continue the project of memorializing and documenting the Bar's history, a project begun by Alissa Hudson and others some years ago. A high point of that project occurred in the commemorative celebration of our 60th anniversary at the 2001 Bar Dinner Dance. This year, we have recommitted ourselves to moving forward with the project and taking it to new levels.

In the coming months and years, as Bar Historian, I hope to do three things. First, I hope to continue recording the Bar's history by interviewing past members of the Bar and gathering pictures, documents and memorabilia from every available source. Second, I hope to begin piecing together a coherent picture of the shifting, changing nature of the Bar and its relationship to the larger community—how our members and their organizations have evolved and how we have affected those around us. Particularly speaking with older members, I often hear about how we have changed over the years, and of the extraordinary effect we have had on the entire Northern Virginia area. Finally, I hope to develop a compelling story about our 70 year history. From the research already available, and from my own conversations over my 17 year history with this organization, I believe that the broader history of our Bar is quite remarkable. I believe that history, which spans more than two generations in this region, is a history of committed, dedicated members of the community, who built the county from the rural community it was to the prosperous, growing and dynamic community it is today. I believe it is a history of individuals, lawyers by training and trade, but family and community members first and foremost, who have driven forward, by their education, skill and force of character, the building of this community which benefits so many. It is a history worth telling to the rest of the State.

To kick the project off for this next phase, we have focused on re-calling our past presidents to become involved again in our Bar, and many have answered the call. In addition to their attendance at the 2011 Bar Dinner Dance for the 70 anniversary, we had 17 of our past presidents at our most recent Bar luncheon. Paul Ebert, Bill Stephens, Judge Richard Potter, Judge Alan Becker, John Foote, Sharon Pandak, Judge Rossie Alston, Cheryl Brunner, Dan Newland, Judge Craig Johnston, Angela Horan, Giff Hampshire, Kathy Farrell, Judge Scott Bailey, Tracy Hudson, Mike Phipps, and Amy Ashworth all joined us at this meeting.

We asked for some memories from these past presidents, and I would group their responses into two categories. First, we had the stories of camaraderie and professional connection with the Bar. Bill Stephens reminisced about being the 25th member of the Bar, with meetings held at George's Lake Jackson Restaurant;

Angela Horan talked about being mentored by John Foote, and about the give and take of ideas over the years with Ed McGolrick, another Bar president; Cheryl Brunner reminded us of how unusually welcoming and supportive our Bar is, spoken from her position after an extended absence from Prince William County; John Foote talked about the changes within the Bar over the years—when he took the presidency, he got the files of the Bar in a banker’s box; and Sharon Pandak and Judge Alston talked alternately about judicial evaluations and the Arthur Sinclair Award, critical steps for the Bar in maintaining and then awarding our own high standards, and the long and seamless tradition in this Bar of mentoring younger attorneys and showing them the way.

But second, we heard other stories about how we have given to and supported our larger communities. From Sharon Pandak and Judge Alston, we heard about the extraordinary growth in pro bono activities over the years, and about the ground-breaking firsts for the Bar in the last 20 years—the first woman and the first African American on the Bench, our first Judges to take the bench of the Virginia Supreme Court and Judge Alston’s own elevation to the Court of Appeals. We also heard via letter from Ralph Coon about the first meeting of the Bar that he attended in 1956, with four people present. He commented especially about how much the association has changed and about how much the Bar Association has improved and continued to help the citizens of this County. From Paul Ebert, our elected Commonwealth’s Attorney now for 43 years, came for me the most memorable statement of the meeting—he has always enjoyed the camaraderie, but in the end, “this Bar is about honor and professionalism.”

So, here are my goals in this historical project: to show that this Bar has been full of mentoring, friendship, and a commitment to the internal regulation and upholding of our ideals as lawyers. But equally, this Bar has always given support to the community around us, because we are part of that community. We, as individuals and as an organization, have tried continuously to provide for the growth and services that our community needs, whether in the building of a hospital or the provision of mental health services, in the mentoring and teaching in the public schools, or in ensuring equal access to justice and the system of justice. We have a great history to document and to broadcast to the community at large—so let’s get started with that task.

And, by the way, I’ll be calling on all of you for help in the coming months and years—so be sure to pick up the phone when I call.

Delinquent Dues Notices

Please be advised, those members who did not pay their dues by February 4, 2011 must now include a late fee of \$10.00 with their dues payments. We have covered six area high schools now, with eight more to go, so are nearly half way through the program for the 2010-2011 school year. To those who have volunteered, thank you so much for your willingness to serve in this capacity and for your flexibility when school cancellations occur.

As is always the case, a small number of attorneys go above and beyond by visiting multiple schools and giving multiple presentations. 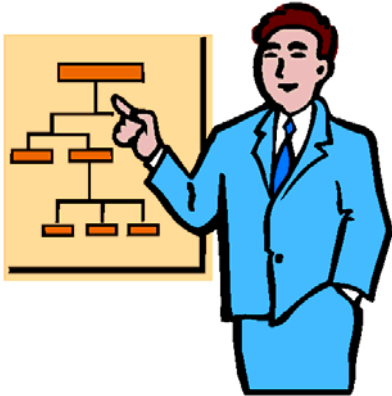

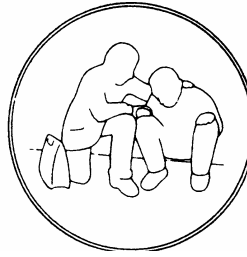
