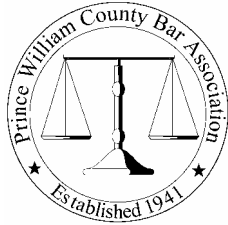

As we are winding down towards the Bar elections, we are busy as ever. November is *pro bono* recognition and volunteer recognition month for the Bar. The November luncheon program, November 7, will feature a law related performing arts presentation by Gray Ghost Theatre which will include me as a participant. It will be a light-hearted post mortem on the historical precedents for dirty politics. On the CLE front, "The Settlement of Personal Injury Claims for Persons Under Disability (a/k/a Infant Settlements) presented by Judge Lon Farris and Tracy Hudson on October 3rd was quite successful, as was the DUI CLE presented by Casey Stevens and myself on October 23. The "Child Support Training" CLE, in support of the Uncontested Divorce Project will take place on October 29 and is sponsored by the *Pro bono* Committee of the Bar. Thank you to Rusty von Keller and a host of others for organizing and presenting this CLE. Also, the Bar sponsored a family horse riding event on October 26 which was organized by Amy Ashworth. It was a great success and the Board as well as the membership continues in its appreciation of all of Amy's efforts in organizing social activities for the Bar.

The annual Bench-Board meetings have been completed. These meetings have yielded a number of issues/recommendations and will be published to the membership by newsletter and listserv. Also, in the previous months, I have written about the new Modest Means Panel that will provide reduced rate legal services to individuals who fall between the cracks of Legal Aid and retained legal services. We are still slightly short of the ten attorneys needed to sign up for this program before we begin to refer clients, so I would again like to strongly encourage the membership to consider participating. Please contact Tracy Hudson, Chair of the MMP, if you have any questions about that program. I would also like to remind the membership that the Prince William County School's Office of Student Management and Alternative Programs is, in conjunction with the Bar, producing an educational brochure on Juvenile Criminal Law. I am still soliciting feedback from the membership as to what information is deemed "essential" for such a brochure.

General District Court Bench Board Meeting September 22, 2008

Minutes Submitted By Jeanice B. Wiethop

In attendance: Judge Johnston, Judge Sievers, Judge Travers, Judge Steketee, Dick Boatwright, Will Jarvis, Petula Metzler, Jonathan Rochkind, Jeani Wiethop, Barry Zweig, Casey Stevens

- Traffic/Criminal dockets - 9am, 10:30am, and 11:30am. Discussion about the desire for consistency about when agreed upon dispositions/motions will be heard. Some judges will take agreed upon dispos/motions from a later docket, some won't and the attorneys must wait until all trials are heard from the earlier dockets. No change.
- Non PWC Bar members on court appointed list – discussion about what, if any, preference is given to PWC Bar members in assigning court appointed cases, and the court's ability to establish criteria and policy. Follow up with Indigent Defense Commission and Atty Gen'l to review this issue.
- The judges prefer that attorney meets clients (in jail) within 48 hours and maintain a local office. Discussion about consequences for attorneys that routinely fail to meet with client in timely fashion – may take them off court appointed list.
- The judges wanted to remind the attorneys in civil cases to have documents and dates ready when case called – be better prepared with calendar.
- Agreed discovery and agreed continuance orders – A reminder for attorneys to use the approved forms and keep to one page. See PWCBA website for forms, under GDC Timesavers, pages 24 and 25. **Another copy of the forms will be disseminated in the next Bar newsletter. See enclosed forms.**
- Immigration consequences of pleas and sentences in GDC. Discussion about judges and defense attorney's obligation, in criminal cases, to advise about potential consequences to their immigration status. All agreed unless attorney is competent to practice immigration law then a referral should be made. No obligation for bench to advise of collateral consequences of plea – no change.
- Court appointed counsel's timesheets – a reminder to turn in time sheets ASAP and all forms at one time. If delay in turning in timesheets, may be delay in processing since the clerk now has to find the file and match it up to the time sheet.
- Should court put inmate ID numbers on court-appointed counsel forms in cases where client is incarcerated? Yes the clerk would put the number on the court appointment form from a list the clerk's office receives from the jail. This will be especially helpful in cases where client has several aliases or jail is having difficulty locating the client.
- Notice of right to chemical analysis in possession of marijuana cases – Discussion as to who gives defendant's this notice. Agreed that it is law enforcement's responsibility to give notice. Training issue with police officers.
- Compliments to the GDC Clerk's office on the attorney phone system – its working great.
- Compliments on the request forms to review file and attorney window.
- Snag file – any document waiting to be filed – seems to be delay in getting these documents to the file.
- Clerk of the Court vacancy– still waiting to be filled. Candidate interviews ongoing. Marion McManus is acting Clerk.

- Spanish speaking clients – Bar requested that some annotation be made on the court appointed assignment form to alert atty that an interpreter is needed. Bar members reporting that some interpreters are stating they “can’t do jail visits,” since they are now state employed. Discussion about whether Spanish court appointed assignment form is needed. Judges to follow up.
- Substitution of counsel. In court appointed cases where appointed counsel has an associate cover the case, it’s best to have substitution order in file, but not necessary. It is not acceptable, however, for court appointed attorneys to pick their own substitution of counsel from other firms, without the court’s permission
- Afternoon trials with civil cases – longer cases taken first and send shorter cases to substitute judges. Bar members have expressed they would like to see shorter cases taken first. Judges response was when the attorneys give more accurate time estimates, they will reconsider the order they take the cases.

◆ These attorneys have represented people *pro bono* this past year at hearings for final protective orders. They offered their expertise to people who are often dismissed by the community because they don't have the words to articulate their needs.

◆ These attorneys have provided the necessary tools to assist people who have been victimized by an abusive partner, prepare to leave their relationship.

◆ These attorneys understand how dangerous the process can be at this point. Most people who are victims of domestic violence have been stripped of their ability to choose for themselves. Consequently, their attention is focused on staying safe and their actions usually don't make sense to others.

◆ These attorneys, rather than jumping to conclusions, simply provided space and guidance for people to tell their story in an orderly fashion. One person who was victimized was surprised when the attorney didn't question her actions as others had. Another felt a sense of protection with the presence of the attorney. Although the respondent didn't refrain from intimidating her at court, she didn't feel alone. Yet another was comforted before and after the hearing while the attorney outlined safety and legal options.

I would also like to take this opportunity to announce the 40th anniversary celebration for ACTS/Turning Points, to be held on February 14, 2009 at the Marine Corps Museum, Quantico, VA. We hope you will share in this joyous occasion as we celebrate the community of people who have been so generous over the years. Professionalism Committee

Arthur W. Sinclair Professionalism Qualifications

The Committee emphasizes both professional competence and courtesy with the following qualities to be considered in designating a recipient:

1. The nominee must have practiced law for a minimum of ten years (of which not all need have been in Prince William County).

2. The nominee must have a high standard of conduct, honor, integrity and courtesy to the legal profession and to those with whom the lawyer comes in contact.

3. The nominee must demonstrate courtesy and respect for the Court, as an officer of the Court, including punctuality, attention to procedures and cooperation with other counsel to identify and solve potential trial problems.

4. The nominee must demonstrate that his word is as binding as a written agreement.

5. The nominee should be vigorously devoted to civility in the Courts, to clients and other lawyers.

6. The nominee must demonstrate concern for the public good, respect for the civil rights and sensibilities of others and, where possible, provide public service.

Any nominee should be one who exercises candor with the Court, is a wise counselor who helps the client find non-confrontational solutions where possible, expeditiously, and for a reasonable fee, thereby facilitating the administration of justice and promoting public confidence in the legal system and legal profession.

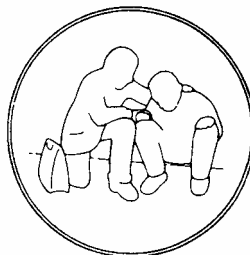
